

The Consecration

The Presider processes to each corner of the ground to be consecrated, making the sign of the cross upon the ground and at each of the four corners of the Columbarium.

At the Entrance Gate

- [P] May the blessing of God Eternal be upon this place and all who enter in to sanctify it and keep it holy, through Christ Jesus our Lord.
- [C] Amen.

At the location of the Fountain

- P] May the blessing of the God Eternal be upon this place as the water from this fountain reminds them of their Holy Baptism into Christ and the promise of life eternal to sanctify it and keep it holy, through Christ Jesus our Lord.
- [C] Amen.

At the Vegetation

- [P] May the blessing of the God Eternal be upon this place, and may this glorious vegetation remind all of God's creative power still working among us birthing, nourishing, and providing for all living things.
- [C] Amen.

At each corner of the Columbarium

- [P] Most merciful God, we pray for all those whom we love, but see no longer. Grant them peace; let light perpetual shine upon them, and in your loving wisdom and almighty power receive them to yourself, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- [C] Amen.

When the Presider has returned to the place where she or he began the procession

- [P] In the name of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, this memorial is now consecrated to be a living sign of our mortality and our sure and certain hope of resurrection through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- [C] Even so, come Lord Jesus. Even so quickly come!

Doxology
