CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS


In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.







Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We give thanks to God that many of the pandemic concerns and restrictions of the past year are now being lifted. Although the virus continues to plague some areas of our country and world, we are thankful that, in the U.S., the number of cases of infection have decreased and the percentage of inoculated people is increasing. I am especially thankful to the Lord that members of Trinity have responded with care and concern for one another as they adapted to the COVID protocols by being open to new and creative ways to maintain our mission of "sharing Jesus' love in worship, fellowship, hospitality and community by doing God's work using our hands."

Although churches have had some exemptions from the earlier, more stringent COVID protocols, Trinity Congregation Council has focused on concern for our members who may be particularly vulnerable to the viral infection. Throughout the pandemic Trinity leadership has made its decisions regarding our congregation's actions based on information from both the scientific community and the recommendations of ELCA and Virginia Synod leadership.

The C.D.C and Governor Northam have announced to the general public that masking, limits to in-person group size and physical distancing when inside buildings are no longer required for those who are fully vaccinated. Those who have not been fully vaccinated are encouraged to continue wearing masks and practicing distancing until they have received their vaccinations. Both the ELCA and ecumenical groups counsel against completely suspending congregational pandemic protocols, especially those involving masks, distancing while in worship and limits on community singing. With continued concern for the health and wellbeing of our entire membership and guests, Trinity Congregation Council recommends the following:

Masks: During in person worship and activities, we ask those who haven't been fully vaccinated to continue to wear a mask. Those who have been fully vaccinated, may use their own discretion to wear or not wear a mask; however, we encourage continuing to mask as a sign of solidarity with and concern for our unvaccinated brothers and sisters.

Physical distancing in building: The ropes on the worship area pews will remain in place throughout the summer months. The Parish Hall is available for worship overflow, if needed. While inside, persons are encouraged to practice the physical distancing that provides personal comfort. We will respect the needs and desires of one another in this regard.

Greeting/hospitality protocols: The tracking done by our greeters on Sundays has been a helpful means to record attendance and welcome persons who are visiting with us; therefore, we will continue this process each Sunday. We've stopped taking temperatures when people enter, and we are gathering for refreshments after worship. If you are not feeling well before arriving at the church (fever, cough, etc.), please consider remaining home and using Zoom or Facebook Live, if possible.

Entry/Exit & building use: Pandemic restrictions on movement in the building, gathering in groups, or second floor usage are no longer in place. With appropriate permission, outside groups may use our facilities.

Additional worship information: We will continue to limit the number of hymns and the verses we sing as well as the sung liturgical parts of worship. Holy Communion will be held on the first Sunday of the month until further notice. Communion elements will be distributed at the front of the nave using wafers and pre-poured cups for the wine. Those distributing the elements will wear gloves. We'll continue to place the bulletins on the pews before worship

If you have questions or concerns about any of the changes, please feel free to talk with me or with any member of the Congregation Council. It has been a difficult year; however, the Lord continues to walk with us bringing love, peace, and hope. Thanks be to God!
