



The church office will be closed tomorrow in observance of Labor Day.

God's Work Our Hands will be observed next Sunday. If you have not already signed up to be part of this day of service, please take a moment to do so this morning. There are three sites of service, you may choose one. Lunch will be provided to all three crews. By now you should have the list of items needed for the hygiene bags. Those working at the Poffenberger home should bring rags, Windex, buckets (and gloves if you wish).

In early 2021 Pastor JMe was contacted by the Sons of the American Revolution (SOAR) inquiring if Trinity would like to recognize the 5 Revolutionary War Veterans buried in the cemetery. SOAR would purchase a brass plaque with their names and service and install it during a special ceremony in which their members would participate dressed in period costume. The idea was brought to the congregation council which voted approval. The plaque should be ready soon and then a ceremony for Oct or Nov can be planned. With that in mind, the third project for the 12th would be to clean, at the very least, the 5 headstones belonging to these veterans. But ideally as many as can safely be cleaned without damaging the stone would make for better photos on the day and show respect to those who are buried there. Cemetery work will need buckets, if anyone has hand pump backpack sprayers, **non**-wire/**non**-metal scrub brushes and/or small whisk brooms. Again, gloves if you wish.

Choir rehearsal will begin on Thursday September 9 at 6PM. The choir is open to all voices, so if you enjoy singing, plan to participate!

Sunday, September 19 will be the start of Sunday School. Children's Sunday School will take place on the third Sunday of each month, during worship. The children will be taken out as a group prior to the reading of the lessons. They will return in time for Holy Communion.

The LCW will have its Yard Sale September 25th, so start cleaning out closets, basements, and garages. No furniture or electronics, please. Clean, gently worn clothing is welcome. Do **not** bring the items to church until you are instructed to do so, closer to the date.
