Amanda and Luis, Angie and Victor, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your children baptized into Christ?

As you bring your children to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

_____, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen.**


WELCOME

¹Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes,





Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,


as we forgive those who trespass against us;


