
Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.







Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name,





Beginning this Sunday, for the foreseeable future, everyone attending in person worship is requested to make a name tag and wear it during worship and coffee time. This is a good way for everyone to get to know one another more easily. For the month of September, we will be singing original liturgies in our Sunday services. They include the Gospel Acclamation, the Memorial Acclamation (Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again) and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God). All three liturgies are based on the Dresden Amen which was first sung in Dresden Germany in the early 19th century. I first got the idea to write the liturgies quoting the Dresden Amen while listening to Felix Mendelssohn's Reformation Symphony on the radio. After it was over, the host of the show talked about Mendelssohn quoting the Dresden Amen several times throughout the symphony. I thought that would work well in our liturgies. The Dresden Amen was written by Johann Gottlieb Naumann (1741-1801) used by Felix Mendelssohn and now it is being quoted in liturgy sung at Trinity Lutheran church. Below is the music, a simple seven note melody that became a powerful musical motif. Take time to you tube the Reformation Symphony, it's beautiful and you will have no trouble hearing "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" and the Dresden Amen.
