

GOSPEL: Matthew 18:15-20


The holy gospel according to Matthew.

Into your wounded hands of love, O God, we place all our prayers, trusting in your mercy through the crucified and risen One. **Amen**



Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.


Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name,




