


CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Christians use the wreath as a sign that Christ reaches into our time to lead us to the light of everlasting life. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent and the growth of light.






PREFACE

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.


For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.






