# **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**


In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.





## **CREED**






# **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

Taste and see that the Lord is good.

Those communing from home, have your package ready to open, but do not consume the elements until the pastor acknowledges those at home and says: "Take and eat. The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ is given and shed for you." Then you may partake.

Communion distribution directions: Communion will be served in continuous fashion with the choir and musicians going first, followed by the congregation. Starting with the front row, please come forward down the center aisle to receive the wafer from the pastor. Take an empty glass from the tray and proceed to the communion assistant on the side you were seated to receive the wine from a pouring chalice. Return to your pews via the side aisles. Worshippers seated in the side chapel/cove will follow those seated on the left side of the nave. If there are worshippers seated in the parish hall, the pastor and a communion assistant will bring the elements to you from the nave. If you do not wish to receive communion, but wish a blessing, please come forward with your arms crossed over your chest.






