





Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.





These are private prayers, not public. We want to respect those wishing confidentiality. March 2 Trinity will host a Community Pancake Breakfast will all proceeds going to the Building Fund. The original fund-raising goal is \$50,000. To date approximately \$24,000 has been donated. Please help spread the word about the Pancake Breakfast.

### Reversible paraments for Lent and Advent

This reversible set of paraments began with the realization that Advent and Lent are counted seasons. We know each year there will be four Sundays (weeks) in Advent and there will be 40 days (7 weeks) in Lent. We even use candles and light to help us count the time to Christmas, each week getting brighter.

When I met with representatives of the congregation we discussed the importance of hymns in worship. I also noted that I have witnessed this congregation work at balancing tradition and the necessity to change. The designs for these seasons reflects that.

The cross and lighted lamps are ancient and familiar symbols. I chose pieced cloth to represent congregational life: a whole made of many, and multiple expressions of the seasonal color. The pieced sections on the pulpit and lectern frontals are a technique I invented last year, which I call process and probability. The pieces of fabric are selected and positioned by at least two people. A throw of a dice limits the players options of what an be done to the fabric square. The small squares remind me of the days in a calendar.

On the altar frontal the squares of fabric represent notes on a musical scale, each note assigned a different fabric print. The Advent frontal is a representation of the refrain of *Joy to the World*, in two-part harmony. The Lenten frontal is a four-part representation of the hymn *In the Cross of Christ I Glory*. Both of these hymns were part of the suggestions from the wonderful women who met with me.

It has been a privilege and a delight to create this work for the people of Trinity. Your light does shine. May God continue to bless you in your work and in your rest.
