

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS


In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**






SECOND READING: Romans 4:13-25

A reading from Romans.

¹³The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

¹⁶For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." ¹⁹He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²²Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." ²³Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his

sake alone, ²⁴but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

Word of God, word of life. Thanks be to God.

³¹[Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. ³²He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."



Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.


Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Sewing for the Savior will meet this Tuesday at 9:30AM in room 204. Anyone with interest in hand sewing quilts is welcome.

During Lent there will be a soup supper each Wednesday (except Feb 28, which will be the community meal) followed by a Taizé service at 7PM. Mark your calendars now and plan to participate.

Pastor JMe will begin a study on the Gospel of Mark, in the parish hall, following worship this morning.

Pick up your copy of the free Lenten devotional booklet in the Narthex.

March 2 Trinity will host a Community Pancake Breakfast 7:30AM-10:30AM with all proceeds going to the Building Fund. The original Building Fund goal was \$50,000 and projects on the list included:

- Church Parking Lot: repair cracks, seal lot, repaint lines (completed)
- Fix A/C (completed)
- Upgrade Security Camera System
- Replace freezer
- Need a new commercial vacuum (completed)
- Repair guttering & drain spouts (completed)
- Loose wire hanging from bell tower
- Fix/repair wood & paint under eve on old sanctuary or have covered with vinyl
- Drain ditch behind Church needs lined with large rock to prevent weeds/overgrowth
- Lights in Parish Hall: Currently one light is out. Lights are discontinued.
- Lights in Narthex: Two ballasts out.
- Parsonage: Storage Building needs to be replaced or remodeled

As you can see there are still a number of items left to be completed and there has been the necessary addition of \$39,000 repairing the foundation beneath the sanctuary. (That work begins this week.) To date approximately \$24,000 has been given to the Building Fund. Your help in spreading the word about the Pancake Breakfast, and your generosity in giving to the Fund is most appreciated.

Trinity is forming a new prayer ministry. This group will throughout the month, but especially on the 15th of the month...so we know that we are all praying together for those on the prayer list at church. These are private prayers, not public. We want to respect those wishing confidentiality. If you are interested in being a part of this ministry—or if you have a prayer request-- speak to Mistie McPadalin, Susan Scheulen or Pastor JMe.

Food pantry donation request this month: soup, macaroni & cheese. Your donations are always most welcome; however, we do ask you remember a few important guidelines: no personal

hygiene or other products unless specifically asked for; no opened products of any kind (this includes unopened items that are in an opened multipack), and please check expiration date and make sure it is at least one year away. The black bin for donations is located in the front stairwell.

The Community Meal will be Wed. February 28 at 5:30PM. Menu is hot dogs, chili, cornbread, salad and dessert. The Lenten Taizé service will follow the meal at 7PM. Those wishing to assist by providing a portion of the meal, helping to set up, clean up or serve, will find a sign-up list in the parish hall. Financial contributions are always welcome, mark your check "community meal" and place it in the offering plate.
