


FIRST READING: Acts 10:44-48

Into your hands, most merciful God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your abiding love; through Jesus Christ, our resurrected and living Lord. Amen.







Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those


who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.





Synod Assembly report: Pastor JMe, Dorrie Greene, and Mike Pyne gathered in Trinity's parish hall last Saturday to participate via Zoom in the annual Virginia Synod Assembly. Here is a brief summary taken from the VA Synod longer report. For details or questions speak to Dorrie, Mike or Pastor. Over 300 Lutherans around the Virginia Synod gathered online via Zoom for the 2024 Virginia Synod Assembly. The Synod welcomed The Rev. Tim Brown, Director of Congregational Stewardship of the ELCA, as our Churchwide Representative. The Assembly elected leaders to serve on the Synod Council, the Consultation Committee, as voting members at the 2025 Churchwide Assembly, and to serve on the ELCA Church Council. They approved the 2025 Investment in Ministry Plan and the Compensation Guidelines for 2025. Bishop Milton and the Synod Officers shared their reports. The Assembly approved a resolution submitted to encourage care for creation. The resolution submitted on privileged associate membership was withdrawn by the author of the resolution. Suzanna Carr (First English, Richmond) presented a report from Asher Porter (Our Savior, Christiansburg), president of the Lutheran Youth Organization. The report shared the impact of the youth ministry of the Virginia Synod providing updates on Synod events.
