PRESENTATION

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. Pastor addresses the children

Jensen, Larry and Memphis, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized into Christ?

*Response: I do.

Pastor addresses the parent of the children

As you bring your children to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with them among God's faithful people,

bring them to the word of God and the holy supper,

teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,

place in their hands the holy scriptures,

and nurture them in faith and prayer,

so that your children may learn to trust God,

proclaim Christ through word and deed,

care for others and the world God made,

and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help *your children* grow in the Christian faith and life? *Response*: I do.

People of God, do you promise to support *Jensen, Larry and Memphis* and pray for them in this new life in Christ?

We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. *To the parent:*

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God,

the powers of this world that rebel against God,

and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Response: I renounce them.

To all present:

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

ACTS 2: 1-21: A DRAMATIC READING FOR PENTECOST

By Ervina Boeve The dramatic reading on these pages was prepared by Ervina Boeve, professor of Speech at Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan, for the Conference on Liturgy and Music at Calvin Seminary, August 1985.

1st Narrator: When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

2nd Narrator: Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Utterly amazed, they asked:

1st Voice: Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans?

2nd Voice: Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language?

3rd Voice: Parthians,

4th Voice: Medes,

5th Voice: Elamites;

6th Voice: residents of Mesopotamia,

7th Voice: Judea,

8th Voice: and Cappadocia;

9th Voice: Pontus

10th Voice: and Asia,

11th Voice: Phrygia

12th Voice: and Pamphylia,

13th Voice: Egypt

14th Voice: and the parts of Libya near Cyrene;

15th Voice: visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism);

16th Voice: Cretans

17th Voice: and Arabs—

18th Voice: we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!

2nd Narrator: Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another,




1st Narrator: Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."



2nd Narrator: Then Peter stood up with the eleven, raised his voice, and addressed the crowd:

Peter: Fellow Jews and all of you who are in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by God through the prophet Joel:

Joel: In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.


INVITATION TO COMMUNION
