
CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

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

Let us pray.



A reading from Exodus.

²⁹ Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. ³⁰ When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. ³² Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the LORD had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. ³³ When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; ³⁴ but whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵ the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him. SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2

A reading from 2 Corinthians.

¹² Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, ¹³ not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. ¹⁴ But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. ¹⁵ Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; ¹⁶ but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. ¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. ¹⁸ And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

^{4:1} Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. ² We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.

²⁸ Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰ Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹ They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³² Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³ Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"—not knowing what he said. ³⁴ While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. 



Rev. Larry Closter

I was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio. The son of a steel worker and the second of five children. After high school I joined the Army and served three years as an infantry soldier in the 82nd Airborne Division. It was there that I felt the call to ordained ministry. Next was college at Point Loma University in San Diego where I met my wife, Laurie. This was followed by four years at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley CA with an internship year at Resurrection Lutheran Church in Juneau, AK.

After schooling I accepted a pastorate at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Kearns, UT, a suburb of Salt Lake City (Kearns was/is 90-95% Mormon). I served there for five years. It was here that our two children, Ryan and Erin, were born. Following that assignment, I rejoined the Army as a chaplain serving a variety of units at various locations throughout the US and numerous short stays throughout the Middle East. I served in the first gulf war followed by five years in Germany. I returned to Utah serving as a chaplain for a chemical and biological unit in the desert where I took examines and qualified for advanced schooling. I attended Harvard Divinity School and received a Th.M. in world religions with an emphasis in Islamic studies in 1999.

I then taught religious studies at the Army Language Institute before 9/11. After that everything changed. I took a number of trips back to the Middle East before being assigned to a military intelligence unit in Japan. I retired from the military in 2002 but was immediately recalled to active duty in Washington DC where I spent a year writing and advising senior military leaders on Islamic issues and practices. Retiring for a second time from the Army I then worked as a civilian in military intelligence addressing Middle East Islamic issues first in the DC area for seven years and then for another seven years in Charlottesville, VA before retiring. During my civilian service time I frequently did pulpit supply on weekends.

Upon retiring from federal service my wife and I moved to Winchester VA to be close to our daughter and two grandchildren. I became a part-time interim pastor at Pleasant View Lutheran Church in Staunton, VA for two years. Following that assignment, I was called by the synod to serve at St. Mark in Quicksburg, VA and a year later added Faith Lutheran in Fort Valley, VA prior to my current position with Trinity Lutheran here in Stephens City, VA.

As an interim pastor I see my mission as one of providing stability and continuity to the congregation by leading worship, visiting the sick and shut-ins, and providing the full spectrum of pastoral care that is needed. My goal is to enable the congregation to be in (or remain in) a position to attract and call a pastor. You should be aware that as we worship and do ministry together it may mean trying new things and/or keeping a dialogue open on issues that are defining our church. From my brief introduction to a few of the people at Trinity I am anxious and excited to see and learn more about the ministry we can do together here.
