

We begin our worship today in a cemetery to remind us that those who have gone before us are very much a part of us. As you can see time and the elements have erased almost everything written on these headstones. They are not forgotten by our Lord—and even though we have not known them personally—the people represented by these headstones are now and forever a part of who we are and who we will become.

#### **Women of Trinity Christmas Lunch**


